“HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL HERITAGE”

Technical requirements to the submitted articles

1. Scientific articles are published in the periodical which refer to the following fields: archaeology, lithography, ethnography, history, museology, art studies and architecture.
2. The article may be submitted in Armenian, Russian or English.
3. Computer typesetting: MS Word, page format 170*240 mm, margins on all sides 20 mm.
4. Text font: Armenian - Sylfaen Unicode, Russian and English - Times New Roman (12 font size, a line spacing of 1.5).
5. Number of pages: 7-20 pages (including abstract).
6. In the center of the top line of the first page the title of the article is written (in 13 font size, capitalized, Bold). Skipping a line the name(s), surname(s), scientific degree/rank are given (Bold, in capital letters, in 12 font size) in the center of the line. In the center of the next line the name of the organization, city, country are given (in 12 font size, in Italics) and below the line the author's email address is given (in 12 font size).
7. Skipping a line an abstract (about 150-200 words) is presented in the same language as the article which should outline the goals, the problems discussed and methodology of the research as well as the author's conclusion (in 12 font size, Italics, Bold).
8. Skipping a line write "Keywords": 7-10 words or phrases (up to three lines).
9. Abstracts in two other languages with relevant keywords follow the main text skipping a line.
10. Skipping a line present the text of the work consisting of introduction, main text and conclusion. The text must be justified on both sides (Alignment: Justify). Start the new paragraphs 1 cm deep. Tables should be numbered and have titles. Attached pictures must be of 300 dpi quality.
11. References are required: they should be given in the footnote, in ascending order (font size - 10, line spacing - 1). The reference text must be justified on both sides (Alignment: Justify). Start the new paragraphs 1 cm deep.

- a) The reference should include the surname and the first letter of the author's name (Bold), then the title of the work, the volume, the place of publication, the publishing house, the year of publication and the number of pages.
- b) In case of more than two authors write the surnames and the first letters of the first two authors' names and after the expression "and others" follow the above mentioned order.
- c) In case of a collection or a journal put the // sign after the title of the article, add the title of the collection/journal and continue according to the order.
- d) If the book is digitized add the word "e-book" at the end of the data. In case of a link to a website, write the website address, then in brackets write the date of using the website: e.g. 02.11.2022.
- e) In case of referring to online resources indicate the author (if available), the title, the internet source and then in brackets write the date of using the website: e.g., 02.11.2022.

12. At the end of the article, skipping a line, under the word «REFERENCES» the Latin transcription of the non-Latin literature used in the article must be inserted in alphabetical order in brackets indicating the language of the original. E.g.

Review and publication procedure

1. Works (scientific articles) not previously published or digitalized may be accepted for publication in the periodical which meet with the terms (see technical requirements, point 1), publishing requirements and have scientific novelty and modernity.
2. Whether the article will be published or not depends on the editorial staff.
3. The editorial staff accepts the article by email.
4. Submitted articles are peer-reviewed.
 - a) The work is reviewed by one of the members of the editorial staff or an independent expert within a month. The review is anonymous both to the author and the reviewer.
5. In case of a negative conclusion the editorial staff either rejects the publication of the article or offers the author to edit the article or sends it to another independent expert informing the author in advance.

6. In case of a positive conclusion the editorial staff prepares the article for publication conforming it to the required editorial standards. Technical changes and corrections arising from publication requirements are not agreed with the author.

Scientific ethics expected from the author

1. Consistent attitude towards copyright. You are not allowed to publish someone else's work under your name (plagiarism) without reference to the appropriate source, as well as the use and publication of unreliable information, data or facts.
2. The author is responsible for the accuracy and reliability of references and citations and is obliged to correct the mistakes noticed in the article on the recommendation of the editors.
3. The editors are not responsible for any inaccuracies or mistakes in the published article.
